"Research priorities for sustainability science" - Online presentation of DKN position paper

The German Committee Future Earth held a public online presentation event of the position paper "Research priorities for sustainability science" on 23 February 2022. With this position paper the DKN highlights pertinent research gaps and suggests forthcoming fields of research. It combines insights from global environmental change research and the environmental social sciences and humanities. This programmatic framework will form the basis of the future work program of the committee itself. Furthermore, it is hoped that it will motivate other scientists to engage across disciplinary boundaries with the manifold epistemological, theoretical, and methodological challenges of sustainability science. The position paper addresses agents in science, science management, and science funding in a national and an international context. The paper has been developed over the past two years. It reflects discussions within the German Committee Future Earth in times of the COVID-19 pandemic and debates on the contents of the paper during the course of the German Sustainability Science Summit 2021.

The Africa Future Earth Global Secretariat Hub has launched

The National Research Foundation (NRF) is pleased to announce its selection to host the Africa Future Earth Global Secretariat Hub. Ebi, representative of the Health Knowledge-Action Networks (Global Research Networks Group), as Assembly co-chairs. The 17 <u>Governing Council</u> members elected Dr. Sirkku Juhola, member of the Global Research Networks group, and Dr. Maria Uhle, member of the Global Secretariat Hubs Boards and Funders group, as Governing Council co-chairs. Both co-chairs will coordinate their respective bodies to accomplish roles and missions of Future Earth.

Land systems are key to overcoming existential challenges facing humanity and achieving sustainable development. Land system scientists from around the globe synthesized their knowledge into 10 Facts on Land Systems that together light the way toward a sustainable future. DFG establishes commission for sustainability

The Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG, German Research Foundation) is seeking to give due consideration to aspects of sustainability in its activities. To this end, the DFG Executive Committee decided in December 2021 to establish a commission. The commission comprises 20 members, including DKN chair Daniela Jacob. It represents the diverse range of subjects in the research system and has now convened for its first meeting. It is to submit recommendations for sustainable action to the DFG bodies in summer 2023. The discussion process will include the perspectives and experience of the DFG Senate Commissions on Earth System Research, on Fundamental Issues of Biological Diversity and on Animal Protection and Experimentation, as well as input provided by the German Committee Future Earth (DKN). 10 Must-Knows from Biodiversity Research 2022 - Forest, food, pandemics and the extinction of species: research network releases '10 Must-Knows' on biodiversity research

The "10 Must-Knows from Biodiversity Research," now published for the first time, range from climate stress for forests and the restructuring of agriculture to the corona virus that has jumped from animals to humans. The inventory on the preservation of nature as the basis of human life was compiled by 45 scientists from the German Leibniz Biodiversity Research Network and colleagues. In the run-up to the World Summit on Nature, the UN Biodiversity Conference in Kunming, China, the report is intended to invite dialogue, according to the researchers. At the same time, they make specific demands of policymakers. Please find more information here.

IPCC Sixth Assessment Report Working Group II and III contributions published

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) published its latest reports on the impacts, adaptation and vulnerabilities related to climate change, and on mitigation of climate change. The Working Group

II contribution to the IPCC Sixth Assessment Report assesses the impacts of climate change, looking at ecosystems, biodiversity, and human communities at global and regional levels. It also reviews vulnerabilities and the capacities and limits of the natural world and human societies to adapt to climate change. The Working Group III contribution provides an updated global assessment of climate change mitigation progress and pledges, and examines the sources of global emissions. It explains developments in emission reduction and mitigation efforts, assessing the impact of national climate pledges in relation to long-term emissions goals. BMBF funding of international collaborative projects within the framework of the national bioeconomy strategy "Bioeconomy in the North 2022": Call for project outlines until 4 May 2022
Building on the former National Research Strategy Bioeconomy 2030 and the National Policy Strategy Bioeconomy, the National Bioeconomy Strategy of the German Federal Government was published in January 2020. Its aim is to support the shift from an economy based predominantly on fossil raw materials to a sustainable, bio-based economy oriented toward natural material cycles. In this context, research is

classified as the key with the help of which the potentials of the bioeconomy can be identified and leveraged. The corresponding research funding for the bioeconomy by the BMBF is divided into six research modules. Current patterns of global development based on people's continuous extraction and exploitation of natural resources are not sustainable, and a societal transition to systems of sustainable consumption and production (SSCP) is urgently needed.
